When ATAA established in 1979, 45 years ago, its main mission was first to fight defamation and attacks on Turkish Americans due to baseless Armenian genocide allegations, and secondly to unite Turkish diaspora and create a stronger, influential community. On August 19, 1977, the President of the Maryland American Turkish Association (MATA), Dr. Ülkü Ülgür, in his letter to the members, stated "it is no news that Türkiye and Turkish-Americans in this country are beset by many problems and recently have been subjected to unfair treatment and discrimination by some other ethnic groups and their political representatives. Your new Board of Directors believe that we clearly need to intensify our efforts for better and more effective representation of our views, especially in the light of growing criticism and hostility from many quarters." Another part of the same letter stated that, "we have reached a tentative agreement with the new president of ATA-DC, Mr. Yavuz Somen, to collaborate and work together in these crucial and vital areas."

Similar letters and notes in the American Turkish Association of Washington, DC (ATA-DC) reflected the concern of this community about the problems faced by Turkish-Americans in this country.

On June 29, 1978, MATA President, Dr. Ülgür, in his letter to ATA-DC President Yavuz Somen stated, "In our recent Board of Directors' meeting we have discussed the possibility of bringing our associations together by affiliating them in some official form. We, as members of the Board of Directors of the Maryland American Turkish Association, believe that such an affiliation will be a giant step forward for better representation of the Turkish community in the Mid-Eastern United States. Therefore, we have unanimously elected three of our distinguished members to form an ad-hoc committee and have instructed them to work jointly with a similar committee so that a solution can be found to realize the goal of uniting these two respected organizations."

The ad hoc committees of ATA-DC and MATA met on November 5, 1978. ATA-DC was represented by President Yavuz Somen, Suat Başaran, and Loren Myers while MATA was represented by President Ülkü Ülgür, Cenap Kıratlı, and the late Alp Karahasan.

By 1979, there was a crying need to address the attacks, the distortions of history, and the discrimination the Turkish-American community was facing every day in their jobs, at schools their children attended, and in their daily lives. Isolated local, Turkish American organizations were unable to cope with the massive work that needed to be done nationwide. Upon his arrival in Washington to take up the post of Ambassador from Türkiye, Dr. Şükrü Elekdağ was met by members of both ATA-DC and MATA at a special reception held at the Navy Officers Club in Bethesda, Maryland on September 23, 1979. He inspired both communities with his dynamic approach to U.S.-Türkiye relations. Now the two communities were no longer talking merely about regional cooperation. Visions of a national umbrella organization were forming.

In the aftermath of threats of yet another arms embargo passing through Congress with virtually no Turkish-American voice raised in opposition, a series of meetings were held in the Washington, DC area. A steering committee was formed in November 1979, headed by ATA-DC President Yavuz Somen with the late Yurdakul Göker and Taşkın Atıl and by MATA President, the late Dr. Alp Karahasan, with Dr. Ülkü Ülgür, Cenap Kıratlı and Dr. Sengun Nuri. The advisor associates were Erol Gürün, Aydın Çağınalp, Hasan Akdemir, Tuncer Kuzay, and Özcan Tuncel. Out of their meetings came an agreement to establish the nationwide Assembly of Turkish American Associations.

Washington, DC was chosen to be the headquarters of the new organization to utilize the vast opportunities for promoting U.S. Turkish relations among policy makers. A Secretariat for the Assembly was established to coordinate the activities, publish a nationwide publication and generally be the central source of information on Turks and Türkiye. For this purpose office space was provided by Adil Araboğlu, a Washington business leader, and the Assembly was in business. Clearly the tasks that lay ahead were enormous and the resources limited.

The first ball was a fundraising activity sponsored by ATA-DC and MATA, and held on December 29, 1979 at the Turkish Embassy. One hundred and forty-six people managed to raise \$17,470 for the Assembly.

ATAA's first publication, ATA-USA was published in February 1980 and news about Turks and Türkiye premiered nationwide. With coordinating committee members Yavuz Somen, Ekrem Bulgur, and Yurdakul Göker from ATA-DC, and the late Alp Karahasan, Ülkü Ülgür, and Cenap Kıratlı from MATA, planned for convening the general assembly on May 17-18, 1980 in the nation's capital pressed forward with great speed.

More than 120 people representing 24 organizations and 5 student associations gathered at the Embassy Row Hotel during this two-day conference and brought plans on the drawing board into reality. The delegates elected the Coordinating Committee members to a special Steering Committee. Their task was to draw up a constitution and bylaws for the Assembly to be presented to the delegates at the next annual convention. Founded to deal with issues confronting the community, the Assembly was not to be given time to grow and mature slowly, but rather would have to come on as an adult and face Armenians crying "genocide," and trying to include their grievances in a national museum dedicated to the memory of six million Jews murdered by the Nazis during World War II. The "Midnight Express" image of Turks and Türkiye was constantly being shown with even President Carter giving it free advertising.

Now there was an organization that was writing letters with the weight of the whole Turkish-American community behind it. Publications were giving the members information about the issues to enable them to set the record straight when they encountered distortions and attacks on their Turkish heritage.

Mustafa Kemal Atatürk: The Brilliant Mind



Edward J. Erickson | Keynote Speaker

Dr. Edward J. Erickson retired as Professor of Military History at the Command and Staff College, Marine Corps University in Quantico, Virginia in 2017 and served in 2018 as a Scholar-in-Residence in the Clark Center for Global Engagement at the State University of New York at Cortland in Cortland, New York. From 2019-2021, he served as Professor of International Relations, Antalya Bilim University in Türkiye. Dr. Erickson is a retired regular US Army lieutenant colonel and was commissioned in the field artillery. He also qualified as a Foreign Area Officer specializing in Türkiye. During his career, he served in artillery and

general staff assignments in the United States, Europe (three tours in Germany and one tour in Italy), and the Middle East (three tours in Türkiye). In the Persian Gulf War of 1991, he served in the Third Armored Division as an artillery battalion operations officer, in Sarajevo in 1995 as a special assistant to the NATO Implementation Force commander, and in the invasion of Iraq in 2003 with the Fourth Infantry Division as General Raymond Odierno's political advisor. He is the recipient of the Legion of Merit, two Bronze Star medals, and numerous other military awards. After retiring from active duty, Dr. Erickson worked as a high school social studies teacher and a school administrator in his hometown of Norwich, New York. He returned to Baghdad, Iraq in 2007 for a year to work as Professor of Political Science at the Ministry of Defense Training and Development College before going to the Marine Corps University in Quantico in 2009. He has master's degrees from Colgate University and Saint Lawrence University as well as a Doctorate in History from the University of Leeds in the UK. Dr. Erickson is widely recognized as one of the foremost specialists on the Ottoman Army during the First World War. Among the numerous books he has written are Ordered To Die, A History of the Ottoman Army in the First World War; Defeat in Detail, The Ottoman Army in the Balkans, 1912-1913; Gallipoli, The Ottoman Campaign; Ottomans and Armenians, A Study in Counterinsurgency; Gallipoli, Command under Fire; and Palestine, The Ottoman Campaigns 1914-1918. He is the co-author of the acclaimed definitive study A Military History of the Ottomans, from Osman to Ataturk. Dr. Erickson is also the author of A Soldier's Kipling, Poetry and the Profession of Arms; A Global History of Relocation in Counterinsurgency Warfare; Phase Line Attila, The Amphibious Campaign for Cyprus; and The Turkish War of Independence, A Military History, 1919-1923. His latest book is Strategic Water; Iraq and Security Planning in the Euphrates-Tigris Basin, Expanded Edition. His forthcoming book for 2025, with co-editor Mesut Uyar, is The Routledge Handbook of Modern Turkish History. Dr. Erickson is frequently interviewed by the media and he is a frequent contributor to scholarly journals and popular magazines. He is married to Jennifer Collins and they live in Macungie, Pennsylvania.

Session 1 | Atatürk's Vision for Education and Reforms, and the Current Situation



Mehmet E. Yaya | Moderator

Dr. Mehmet E. Yaya was born and raised in Türkiye He completed his bachelor's degree in Boğaziçi University before he moved to the USA in 2003. He obtained his MBA from Auburn University, then received his master's and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Alabama. He moved to Michigan in 2009. He is currently the Professor of Economics in the Department of Economics at Eastern Michigan University. His research focuses on immigrants, income inequality, and poverty and he has published number of articles in well-respected academic journals on these topics. Mr. Yaya has actively been involved with Turkish American

organizations. He was the founder of Turkish Student Association at the University of Alabama before he moved to Michigan. In Michigan, he has been a diligent volunteer for the Turkish American Cultural Association (TACAM); served as a board member for 2 years and treasurer for 4 years and president between 2019 and 2023. His involvement with TACAM specifically encompasses the education, political outreach, Atatürk Park and fundraising activities of TACAM. He has been serving at the Assembly of Turkish American Associations (ATAA) board since 2018, first as a Mid-Central VP and then as a treasurer.



Gary M. Grossman

Gary M. Grossman, Emeritus Professor in the School for the Future of Innovation in Society at Arizona State University (ASU), offers four decades of experience in addressing institutional factors impacting social transformation in both theoretical and applied contexts, involving local, national, and global issues. Utilizing a deeply interdisciplinary perspective, his work seeks to identify the barriers to human progress and identify avenues for inclusive change. His areas of focus include higher education, sustainable development, and democratization in the emerging societies, with a special interest in the Southern European, Eastern Mediterranean, and Middle

East regions. Trained as a political sociologist and experienced in the administration of World Bank, U.S. Government, and privately funded projects, Professor Grossman also led the development of new curricula, academic units, and campuses at Arizona State University and elsewhere around the world. A special focus of his work was the cofounding of a unique transdisciplinary, transnational major in ASU's Master of Science in Technology program. This degree concentration, entitled 'Global Technology and Development' (GTD), features the combined perspectives of social science research and emerging technological models, aimed at providing students an opportunity to explore the critical questions of globalization, commerce, sustainable development, information technology, transportation, education, and biotechnology which impact all nations. The program is designed to empower students to guide and direct those impacts. Classes in the GTD program began in 2001, became a stand-alone Master of Science program in 2012, and transitioned to the School for the Future of Innovation in Society in 2015. Professor Grossman is internationally recognized for leadership in his areas of interest and has expressed his work in numerous peerreviewed and public interest publications, policy briefs, and presentations in many forums around the world, as well as in large and small-scale project management. Professor Grossman was awarded two consecutive Fulbright Grants (2002-2004) and spent that period engaged in research and teaching at Middle East Technical University (METU) in Ankara, Türkiye. Between 2019 and 2022, he worked as an International Programme Consultant/Visiting Scientist with the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization (UN FAO) in Rome, Italy. His current research concerns the implementation efficacy of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) globally, with a particular focus in the nations of Central Asia, and the future of the Turkish Republic as it enters its second century.



Selcuk Sirin

Selcuk R. Sirin, Ph.D., is a Professor of Applied Psychology at New York University specializing in the study of marginalized children and youth, focusing on improving educational and mental health services. His research covers the social and economic impacts on various groups including African American students, Muslim American youth, immigrants' children, and refugees in the US, Europe, and Türkiye. Published in leading journals across psychology, education, and health, Şirin has earned multiple awards for teaching excellence and research innovation, notably from Boston College, NYU, the Foundation for Child Development, and

the American Educational Research Association. He also received the 2018 Jacobs Foundation Prize for Social Engagement, Sirin co-authored "Muslim American Youth" in the US and authored five bestsellers in Türkiye. Freedom vs. Misery (Ya Özgürlük Ya Sefalet). A Dream for Türkiye (Bir Türkiye Hayali), Justice vs. Misery (Ya Adalet Ya Sefalet) focusing on societal problems. He also published two best-selling parenting books in Turkish: Raising Children (Yetişin Çocuklar) and Raising Adolescents (Yetişin Gençler). Dr. Şirin founded the 1 Million Book Project in 2019 and distributed over a million free children's books in Türkiye to families with no access to children's books. Sirin has a weekly column in Oksijen, the best selling weekend paper in Türkiye and previously wrote for Hurriyet (2014-2018). And he is from Ardahan, formerly Kars.

After graduation, he worked as a Forensic Software Programmer for 3 years, and he joined the Cleveland Clinic and has been working at Cleveland Clinic for 10 years. As a Software Analyst and Project Manager, he involved in the development of the Cleveland Clinic websites and various supporting applications. He is currently working at IT Cybersecurity Department as an Enterprise Cybersecurity Engineer to

secure all the applications and websites. He has been actively involved with Turkish American organizations since he moved to the US. Ateş has been serving as ATAA Mid-Central Region VP since 2020. He served as VP of the Turkish American Society of Northeast Ohio (TASNO) for two years. He is currently serving as the President of TASNO. He is playing an active role for the establishment of the Atatürk and Women Statues at the Turkish Cultural Garden in Cleveland. Ates is married with two sons and a daughter.



Behçet Açıkmeşe

Dr. Açıkmeşe received his M.S. in mechanical engineering and his Ph.D. in aerospace engineering from Purdue University. He was a technologist and a senior member of the Guidance and Control (G&C) Analysis Group at NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) from 2003 to 2012 and was a visiting Assistant Professor of Aerospace Engineering at Purdue University before joining JPL. At JPL, he developed guidance, control, and estimation algorithms for formation-flying spacecraft and distributed networked systems, proximity operations around asteroids and comets, and planetary landing, as well as developing interior

point methods algorithms for the real-time solution of convex optimization problems. Dr. Açıkmeşe's research developed a fundamental result, known as "lossless convexification", that provides the solution of a general class of nonconvex optimal control problems via computationally tractable convex optimization methods. This theoretical insight led to a leap in the G&C technology that now made planetary pinpoint landing feasible. NASA has been investing on the demonstration of this technology to mature it for next generation missions to Mars and other planets. Dr. Açıkmeşe also worked on NASA missions. He was a member of NASA's Mars Science Laboratory (MSL) G&C team, where he developed and delivered G&C algorithms used in the "fly-away phase" of the successful Curiosity rover landing in August 2012. He also developed Reaction Control System (RCS) algorithms for NASA's SMAP (Soil Moisture Active Passive) mission, which will be launched in 2014.


